Hats

It is an expectation that all students wear hats in term 1 and term 4 as per our Sunsmart Policy. Any student who does not have a school hat will be asked to sit in a shaded area for play time.

Uniform

We have noticed that quite a few students are not wearing our school uniform to start the school year. We understand that there have been some delays at the Uniform Shop, but we would encourage you to have your children in full school uniform as soon as possible.

Once the uniform situation has settled, wearing non-school hoodies and windcheaters are not acceptable attire and students will be asked to remove them if seen at school.



Mobile Phones

It has been a State Government directive that students are not to have mobile phones in their classrooms at any stage. Contact during the school day using FaceTime, Messenger or any other communication is also prohibited. If you would like to contact your child during the school day you can contact the office and we will pass on the message.

Anyone not handing mobile phones in to the office at the start of the school day will have them confiscated and will be asked not to return them to school in future.

BYOD—Bring Your Own Device

Our Year 4-6 classes are able to bring an iPad to use in class as a tool to enhance their learning. Students will be permitted to add their device to our network and will have exclusive access to that device. We have found that students who have their own device are very responsible with it and are always able to access information when directed by the teacher.

Students who do not have a device are still given access to technology, but often they have to share with others and do not get to take the devices home.

Book boxes and yearly fees

This year we have taken the liberty of ordering class sets of books and stationery to use in the classroom. This is a \$50 component that contributes to the overall cost of your yearly fees. Fees are now due and can be paid at the office using cash or direct debit. The charge for 2020 is \$200 for all students. Other costs will arise throughout the year to cover the cost of excursions, sporting activities and camps. Notes will be sent out for each of these activities as they

arise. If you are facing financial hardship and need some extra time to pay your fees, you are more than welcome to discuss this with myself or Mr Daxecker as soon as possible.

Car Parking

As you are well aware the car park is becoming busier with each passing day. I commend everyone on their patience so far this year and ask that you continue to drive at walking pace around picking up and drop off times. We ask that the first three parking bays at the entrance to the school remain vacant at all times unless you are driving through to pick up or drop off your children. Parking in these bays causes problems as people enter the car park to pick up or drop off their children. I encourage anyone who lives close by to walk or ride to school to minimise traffic after school. We would like to keep everyone safe during these times, so your cooperation in this matter is very much appreciated.

New toilets

On Monday we will be opening our new toilet block at the rear of the school. It will double the number of toilets that we have on site and enable students in the portables to have a shorter distance to travel when needed. We will continue

to develop other areas of the school as the year continues.

Attendance

We encourage all students to attend school on time and every day. In order to maximise learning, it is imperative that students are learning in sequence, therefore being here every day is important. Of course, if your child is sick you will need to keep them at home as not to spread sickness to others. It would also be appreciated if you could contact the office to report any absences. Failure to call the office will result in a phone call from us to find out where your child is.

Big Childcare

We welcome Big Childcare to our school as our before and after school care provider. We have already seen many students access this service which hopefully helps working families to ensure their children are looked after before or after school. Any students who are at school before 8.30am or have not been picked up after 3.30pm may be sent to before or after care and if they attend, parents will be charged for the service. If you are going to be late to pick up your children for whatever reason, please call the office.



Coronavirus update



I sent out Department of Education device through FlexiBuzz to explain the current Coronavirus situation in Victoria and how we are dealing with it. The updated advice from the Department of Education recommends that parents/guardians/carers should ensure that any student returning from mainland China (not including Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan) who was in mainland China on or after **1 February 2020** is isolated at home and should not attend school until 14 days after they were last in mainland China.

A Word from Wellbeing

Attendance

Why going to school is important:

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day. Attending and participating in school will help your child develop:

- important skills and knowledge to help them learn.
- social and emotional skills such as good communication, resilience and team work.

There is no safe number of days for missing school. Each day a student misses puts them behind. Just a little bit late for school doesn't seem like much, but . . .

If your child is missing	That equals	Which is	And over 13 years of
10 minutes per day	50 minutes per week	Almost 1.5 weeks of the school year	Almost half a year of school
20 minutes per day	1 hour 40 minutes per week	Over 2.5 weeks per school year	Almost 1 years of school
Half an hour per day	Half a day per school week	4 weeks per school year	Almost 1.5 years of school
1 hour per day	1 day per school week	8 weeks per school	Over 2.5 school years

Tips to help improve your child's attendance

- Talk to your child about school and how important it is. You can ask them how they feel about school, what they liked and if there are any problems.
- Reward good behaviour and not bad behaviour. For example, if your child refuses to go to school, do not let them have access to their phones or the internet
- Set a good example. Show them how you keep to your own commitments.
- Encourage your child to take on hobbies that your child enjoys such as sports and clubs. This will help them develop positive relationships outside of the classroom
- Leave all technology out of their bedroom
- Pack their school bag the night before with everything they need
- Have a set time for breakfast
- Speak to your school if you have concerns about your child's attendance or behaviour.
- Did you know that your child's best learning time is the start of the school day? That's when every minute counts the most.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support



Parking

Our car park is very busy at school drop off and pick up times; it is important that everyone drives slowly and maintains calm when picking up children. We want all our students to be safe. If you live nearby, please consider walking to school or try carpooling if walking is not an option.

OBEY THE SIGNS

Parking unsafely puts children at risk

There are parking restrictions surrounding schools. The areas are regularly patrolled by City of Melton Local Law Officers, purposely for the safety of children, the community. Council conducts enforcement actions by the way of infringement notices to seek compliance and educate on unsafe parking matters, which can put a person in danger.

No Stopping (Min Penalty \$161)

You must not stop at the kerb or any reason where No Stopping signs are located or within 10 metres of an intersection



No Parking Signs (Min Penalty \$81)

You may stop for up to 2 minutes but must not leave your vehicle

Speed Limit

Do not exceed 40km/h in school zones.



Other common parking offences


- Parking on a naturestrip
- Unreasonably obstructing (flow of traffic)
- Double parked
- Stop too close to a school crossing
- Park within 3 metres of a continuous dividing line or dividing strip.

Medical Forms

- It is a Department of Education requirement that any medication administered at school, must first be authorised in writing by the parent/carer.
- Requests for administration staff to administer medication must be made at the school office. Parents are asked not to make individual requests to the class teacher.
- Parents who require the administration of medication for their children during school hours (including asthma preventatives or relievers) are asked to provide the medication to the school office and to complete the necessary health authorisation form.
- The school requests that prescription medication is supplied to the school in pharmacy labelled bottles.
- Staff will not administer any medication (short or long term) without this written authorisation.




