Principal's Message

Welcome back to school for what promises to be a much improved 2021. We welcome all the new students and families who have joined us this year and hope you enjoy your time with us at Rockbank Primary School.

Face Masks & Physical Distancing

We would ask that you physically distance when waiting for your children before and after school. You are unable to meet indoors with teachers at this stage and if you would like to catch up with a teacher it is either done outside after school or via a phone or Webex conversation. Face masks are compulsory in indoor areas, but are not required outside provided you physically distance. Therefore, if you going to the office you will need to wear a face mask or you will not be allowed entry into the building. Everyone has been doing an excellent job with these restrictions and I encourage you to continue in this manner as we do not want to return to remote learning in 2021.

Parking

Please observe all signage around the school in regard to

parking. The three parking bays at the front gates are for pick up and drop off only. Please don't park in these spaces and get out of your car as it holds up traffic coming into the car park.

If you wish to get out of your car it would be best to park in one of the angled parks.

Parking on the nature strip outside the school can also attract a fine. Parking on the road on the school side of Westcott Pde is permitted, but probably not your safest option, so I would park in the amongst the houses and walk if you are able. I will send out a brochure on SeeSaw outlining where you are able to park as designated by the Melton Council. I am unfortunately unable to assist anyone who receives a fine due to parking illegally.

These measures are in place to ensure that all of our students can remain safe.

New Playground

We have installed a new playground over the holidays for our Year 3-6 students to use. It will be available for use by Monday. Much of our fundraising over



2019 and 2020 has helped to purchase this much needed item for the yard.

Parent Information Sessions

It has been my pleasure, amongst all staff, to see the smiling faces of all our students join us at Rockbank Primary School.

Since beginning the year, students have been engaging in the Ready to Learn Program. This program allows students to understand the expectations for learning and to build a sense of belonging and connection with the school. Managing illness in schools and early childhood

One of the most important things we can do to slow the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) in our community is to stay at home when we are unwell, even when we have the mildest of symptoms.

What you need to know

1. If a child is unwell, even with the mildest of symptoms, they must stay at home

If a child becomes unwell during the day, they must be collected from school/early childhood education and care (ECEC) as soon as possible.

2. If a child has any of the symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) outlined below, however mild, they should get tested and they must remain at home until they receive their results:

- fever
- chills or sweats
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath
- runny nose
- loss of sense of smell or taste.

In certain circumstances headache, muscle soreness, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea may also be considered symptoms.

3. A child must stay at home until they are symptom free, even if their coronavirus (COVID-19) test is negative

If a person has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) or been identified as a close contact they must isolate/quarantine until they receive clearance from DHHS.

Children with persistent symptoms due to underlying conditions such as hay fever or asthma

whose symptoms are clearly typical of their condition can continue to attend ECEC/school. They should be tested for COVID-19 if they develop symptoms that are different to or worse than their usual symptoms. They should consider getting a medical certificate from their GP to attend ECEC/school if they have persistent symptoms that may overlap with symptoms of COVID-19 such as cough or runny nose.

Younger children (pre-school up to Grade 2) may have prolonged post viral symptoms

such as a runny nose or cough and may return to school/ECEC following a negative COVID-19 test even if they are not completely free of symptoms. They will need a medical certificate from their GP to confirm they are otherwise well or have recovered from their acute illness.

For information on the minimum periods students and children need to stay at home for other conditions, refer to the [DHHS school exclusion table](#).

4. Children do NOT need a medical certificate before returning to school/ECEC

Once symptoms have cleared, there is no requirement from the Department of Education and Training or DHHS for children/students to have a medical certificate before they return to school/ECEC.

Thank you for your support in following these steps, together we can all stay safe.

We are SunSmart - a note for families



Too much UV can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage and skin cancer.

Overexposure to UV during childhood and adolescence is a major factor for future skin cancer risk.

You can't see or feel the sun's UV so don't be fooled. Whatever the weather, if the UV levels are three or more, it's important to **Slip, Stop, Slap, Seek and Slide!**

Our service aims to protect children and staff from too much UV to help minimise future skin cancer risk. We are a registered member of the Cancer Council Victoria's SunSmart Program. Please help support our SunSmart membership by ensuring your child follows the SunSmart measures encouraged by educators.

During the daily local sun protection times (issued whenever UV levels are three and above), use these 5 SunSmart steps – even if it's cool and cloudy.

1. **Slip on a shirt** - dress your child in clothing that covers as much skin as possible (e.g. elbow length tops with a higher neckline or collar and longer style shorts or skirts). Densely woven fabrics are best.
2. **Slap on SPF 30 (or higher) broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen** – apply a generous amount of sunscreen at the start of the day and provide permission for sunscreen to be reapplied to your child before they go outdoors. This should be applied every two hours. From 3 years of age, please help your child apply their own sunscreen so they can start to learn independent skills.
3. **Slap on a hat** – one that protects the face, neck and ears such as a broad brimmed, legionnaire or bucket style hat. Peak caps do not offer enough protection and are not recommended by SunSmart. Please help your child remember to bring and wear their approved sun hat.

4. **Seek shade** – choose shady spots for play whenever possible.
5. **Slide on some sunglasses** - if practical and approved by the service. Make sure they are labelled AS 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.



Sun protection times

Don't just wait for hot and sunny days to use sun protection. Check the sun protection times each day so your family can be protected when they need to be.

Daily local sun protection times and weather details are available on the free SunSmart app or widget, in the weather section of the newspaper and on the SunSmart website at sunsmart.com.au. Sun protection times can also be found at the Bureau of Meteorology website and live UV levels are available from ARPANSA.



Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund applications



CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs

Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

Forms have been sent home, but please if you need another form, please feel free to contact the school office on (03) 9747 1210 and ask for an application form or download it from our website.

You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page.

School Council Elections



WHAT IS A SCHOOL COUNCIL AND WHAT DOES IT DO?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

INTERESTED?

School Councils are made up of parents, staff, community members and the principal. To be a school councillor, you must have an interest in the school and be able to work cooperatively with others to shape the school's future. If you're a parent, guardian or staff member, you must nominate yourself to be a school councillor and then be elected through a vote (if required). A term on School Council is for 2 years. Rockbank Primary School Council has 6 parent representatives, with 3 parent placements and 1 Community member placement becoming available this year.

There are 2 sub-committees within the School Council including Finance and Fundraising.

Meetings are held every third Monday of the month from 5.30pm.



BYOD iPad Program



To enable greater access to devices at our school, students in Year 3-6 are permitted to bring an iPad that would be connected to our school network. This is not a compulsory program, but many of our Year 5/6 students already access this program and find it beneficial as they get exclusive access to a device. We provide other digital options for students who don't have a device, so no students are disadvantaged if they do not have their own iPad. Students are responsible for the safe keeping of their devices and it is advised that there is a hardened case on the device before it comes to school and possibly a glass protector. The school will take no responsibility for any damage to devices, although there have been very few instances of damage in this program in its 3 years of operation thus far. School Wide Positive Behaviour Support

Notes Home

Please remember to ask your child each night if there are any letters or notes from school.

Often, our correspondence home will be asking for payments or parent consent by a certain date. Any payments need to be in the provided envelope with your child's details. As per our Events Policy, late submissions cannot be accepted.

'Late submissions will not be accepted as it takes significant time and effort to organise and approve events. The office needs to complete a range of administrative and financial tasks that enable the correct Student Permission Form to be ready for distribution to families.'

Parking

Our car park is very busy at school drop off and pick up times; it is important that everyone drives slowly and maintains calm when picking up children. We want all our students to be safe. If you live nearby, please consider walking to school or try carpooling if walking is not an option.

OBEY THE SIGNS

Parking unsafely puts children at risk

There are parking restrictions surrounding schools. The areas are regularly patrolled by City of Melton Local Law Officers, purposely for the safety of children, the community. Council conducts enforcement actions by the way of infringement notices to seek compliance and educate on unsafe parking matters, which can put a person in danger.

No Stopping (Min Penalty \$161)

You must not stop at the kerb or any reason where No Stopping signs are located or within 10 metres of an intersection



No Parking Signs (Min Penalty \$81)

You may stop for up to 2 minutes but must not leave your vehicle

Speed Limit

Do not exceed 40km/h in school zones.



Other common parking offences

- Parking on a naturestrip
- Unreasonably obstructing (flow of traffic)
- Double parked
- Stop too close to a school crossing
- Park within 3 metres of a continuous dividing line or dividing strip.


