Car Parking

We have started the year off with just under 300 students, which means it is very busy each morning and afternoon in the car park.

To make the morning drop off run more smoothly we would ask that you keep the 7 car spaces along the curb vacant and use them for quick drop offs only. This ensures we can ensure we are not causing traffic jams on Westcott Pde.

If you are using these spaces you need to ensure you vacate the car parks quickly and if you intend to get out of your car we would appreciate

if you could park your car in one of the many angled car spaces in the car parking area.

You will also need to observe signage when parking around our school. It is illegal to park on the nature strip on Westcott Pde, therefore you will need to ensure all four tires are positioned on the road when parking. Parking on the Ballarat Rd side of Westcott Pde is not permitted and will result in a fine if a parking inspector were to attend.

We appreciate you doing your best to keep our students and community safe.

Uniform

A reminder that uniform is compulsory at our school. All jackets, jumpers and polo shirts need to have the school logo on them. School hats are compulsory in Term 1 & 4. Please ensure you pick one up from our uniform shop—PSW or your child will be asked to sit in the shade during playtimes. For hygiene reasons we will not be supplying spare hats to students.

COVID Cases

We have had a couple of COVID cases since the return to school and seem to have limited movement of these individuals to minimise the risk to others. Please ensure that you are using the Rapid Antigen Test kits twice a week to assist us in keeping COVID numbers at school low. If your child tests positive to COVID you will need to contact the school and report this to the Department of

Health.

Children who are household contacts of positive cases also need to isolate for 7 days, even if they have not tested positive for COVID.

Rapid Antigen Tests

We were supplied with 240 Rapid Antigen Tests when they were delivered last week. Having started the year with just under 300 students we were short about 100 kits. Therefore we had to give out only one kit to students who had siblings. We understand that you may be waiting for your next kits and we are assured that a delivery is imminent.

Rapid Testing is an important way for us to potentially catch any COVID cases that might be in the community as quickly as possible.

Vaccination Hub

We are currently in negotiations to have a 5-11 Year old vaccination hub located at our school that will be available to the local community who may be having difficulty accessing jabs for their young people elsewhere. It is up to each individual family whether they decide to vaccinate their children and is not a compulsory program.

EVERY DAY COUNTS

This information is about students attending school. It is for their families and carers.

You and your child are an important part of your school's community.

Students will be returning to face-to-face learning in Term 1 and great things will be happening at your Rockbank Primary School this year. We are so excited to have your child in the classroom, where they can receive the support that they need to succeed and have a happy experience at school this year.

Every day of attending school counts. Being at school supports your child's learning, social and mental wellbeing.

Supporting our students

Schools will be making sure classrooms are as safe as possible for students and will be monitoring their mental, physical and social wellbeing.



Your child's school will support students who need to catch up. Teachers will work with students to understand who may need extra learning support. Some students may be offered tutoring or other assistance to ensure that they are able to participate and enjoy their lessons.

Schools also have programs and staff who can respond to a range of student health and wellbeing needs.

If you have any questions or concerns about your child, you can contact your child's teacher and you can talk with them about how the school can support your child.

Providing a COVID Safe environment

Your child's school is operating in a COVIDSafe way. Schools will make sure that staff and students wear masks, stay home when unwell, and physical distance when appropriate.

Schools will provide free, regular COVID rapid antigen testing for students to help keep them safe.

There will be voluntary rapid antigen testing in place for the first four weeks of Term 1 2022. The Victorian Government will deliver more than 14 million rapid antigen tests to schools and early childhood education and care services.

Your child's school will let you know if there has been a positive COVID case at school and what you need to do.

Helping keep your school community safe

Everybody has an important role to play. Mask wearing, hand washing and having your child vaccinated are all very important. All children aged 5 years and over can receive a vaccination and help to protect their family, friends and school community.

If your child is unwell, or has symptoms, keep them at home and notify your school.


Learning in Numeracy at Rockbank Primary School

Happy New Year and welcome back to another year at Rockbank Primary School. Below you can view a range of activities to show students how we can use maths to get to know our students, as well as each other.




In Miss Lane's Foundation class (left), students used their birthday to create a months of the year display. Students practiced naming the months of the year, their order, the month they were born in and placing their birthday in sequential order. They also discussed which months had the most birthdays, the months that had the same amount and which has zero.

Miss Bencich and her students have been working on one number each day. Our little mathematicians identify the number on a number line as well as the number bond, by showing which two numbers equal that amount. Students represent the number in a variety of ways to explore how the number can be displayed while investigating number facts to ten.



Miss Magnano's class (right) collected data to determine their favourite fruits. They created a pictograph using this data to clearly show which fruits had been voted for and the amount of votes each fruit had. Watermelon was the most popular fruit with 9 votes, whilst apples came in second with 6 votes. This is one of the ways, Year ½ students will represent the data they gather in class.

Year ½ students with Miss Andrews created their own number posters (right), by focusing on matching the numeral to the number names. Tens frames, bundles and tally marks were used to explore how these amounts could be counted more efficiently before students practiced their tens facts.



Our young ones have had a great start to the year and have already enjoyed challenging themselves. We look forward to seeing growth and resilience in numeracy.

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Mandatory masks

Which year levels are face mask mandated for?

The wearing of face masks is mandatory for all Victorian student in Grade 3 and above.

Face masks are strongly recommended for Prep to Grade 2 students.

Can the school force my child to wear a mask?

The school will not force your child to wear a mask. We understand some children will not be able to wear a mask.

Face masks are required for students in Grade 3 to Grade 6 unless an exception applies. Exceptions include students with a physical or mental disability where their disability means it would not be suitable. Parent/carers of a student/s who meet the criteria for an exception must provide their approval in writing for their child/ren to not wear a mask to the school.

Our school will follow the directions of the Victorian Chief Health Officer and aims to provide the safest environment possible for students and staff. I strongly encourage you to discuss wearing masks with your children to reduce COVID-19 transmission risk for their health and for other childrens' health as well. When we all work together as a community, we will have the best chance to keep children healthy and reduce the risk of them catching and spreading COVID-19.

For children who are able to wear a mask, they can and should wear a mask. For those children who cannot on some days or all days, that is okay. Almost all children will be able to and we will help them learn and support them to use masks well, when indoors, throughout the school day.

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We are SunSmart - a note for families



Too much UV can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage and skin cancer.

Overexposure to UV during childhood and adolescence is a major factor for future skin cancer risk.

You can't see or feel the sun's UV so don't be fooled. Whatever the weather, if the UV levels are three or more, it's important to **Slip, Stop, Slap, Seek and Slide!**

Our service aims to protect children and staff from too much UV to help minimise future skin cancer risk. We are a registered member of the Cancer Council Victoria's SunSmart Program. Please help support our SunSmart membership by ensuring your child follows the SunSmart measures encouraged by educators.

During the daily local sun protection times (issued whenever UV levels are three and above), use these 5 SunSmart steps – even if it's cool and cloudy.

1. **Slip on a shirt** - dress your child in clothing that covers as much skin as possible (e.g. elbow length tops with a higher neckline or collar and longer style shorts or skirts). Densely woven fabrics are best.
2. **Slap on SPF 30 (or higher) broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen** – apply a generous amount of sunscreen at the start of the day and provide permission for sunscreen to be reapplied to your child before they go outdoors. This should be applied every two hours. From 3 years of age, please help your child apply their own sunscreen so they can start to learn independent skills.
3. **Slap on a hat** – one that protects the face, neck and ears such as a broad brimmed, legionnaire or bucket style hat. Peak caps do not offer enough protection and are not recommended by SunSmart. Please help your child remember to bring and wear their approved sun hat.

4. **Seek shade** – choose shady spots for play whenever possible.
5. **Slide on some sunglasses** - if practical and approved by the service. Make sure they are labelled AS 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.



Sun protection times

Don't just wait for hot and sunny days to use sun protection. Check the sun protection times each day so your family can be protected when they need to be.

Daily local sun protection times and weather details are available on the free SunSmart app or widget, in the weather section of the newspaper and on the SunSmart website at sunsmart.com.au. Sun protection times can also be found at the Bureau of Meteorology website and live UV levels are available from ARPANSA.

Celebrating your child's birthday in the classroom

Birthdays are special and we know that many students at Rockbank Primary School love to celebrate their birthdays with their classmates. We encourage birthday celebrations involving food to take place outside of school hours, but recognise there are times when this cannot occur

For families wanting to bring a special treat to share, please provide small, individual treats for all class members eg, cupcakes, chocolate crackles, honey joys etc. **All treats must be nut free.**



Alternatively, families may consider providing a small gift such as stickers, stationary items, pencils or erasers to reduce the amount of sugary food being bought into the classroom.



At Rockbank Primary School we ask that you please **DO NOT** bring lolly pops, lolly bags, ice-cream cakes, or whole cakes that need to be cut up and distributed.



For families of children with allergies, we ask that you please provide your child's teacher with a selection of small allergy friendly treats from home that can be given to your child when a birthday is being celebrated.

Parents who do not want their child receiving food based birthday treats must let the teachers know and also have the option of providing an alternate treat for their child.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund applications



The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

BYOD iPad Program

To enable greater access to devices at our school, students in Year 3-6 are permitted to bring an iPad that would be connected to our school network. This is not a compulsory program, but many of our students already access this program and find it beneficial as they get exclusive access to a device. We provide other digital options for students who don’t have a device, so no students are disadvantaged if they do not have their own iPad.

Students are responsible for the safe keeping of their devices and it is advised that there is a hardened case on the device before it comes to school and possibly a glass protector. The school will take no responsibility for any damage to devices, although there have been very few instances of damage in this program in its years of operation thus far. If you would like further information on this, please speak to your child’s teacher.



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Notes Home

Please remember to ask your child each night if there are any letters or notes from school.

Often, our correspondence home will be asking for payments or parent consent by a certain date. Any payments need to be in the provided envelope with your child's details. As per our Events Policy, late submissions cannot be accepted.

'Late submissions will not be accepted as it takes significant time and effort to organise and approve events. The office needs to complete a range of administrative and financial tasks that enable the correct Student Permission Form to be ready for distribution to families.'

We thank all our families in advance for your adherence and understanding of this process.



Parking

Our car park is very busy at school drop off and pick up times; it is important that everyone drives slowly and maintains calm when picking up children. We want all our students to be safe. If you live nearby, please consider walking to school or try carpooling if walking is not an option.


OBEY THE SIGNS

Parking unsafely puts children at risk

There are parking restrictions surrounding schools. The areas are regularly patrolled by City of Melton Local Law Officers, purposely for the safety of children, the community. Council conducts enforcement actions by the way of infringement notices to seek compliance and educate on unsafe parking matters, which can put a person in danger.

No Stopping (Min Penalty \$161)

You must not stop at the kerb or any reason where No Stopping signs are located or within 10 metres of an intersection



No Parking Signs (Min Penalty \$81)

You may stop for up to 2 minutes but must not leave your vehicle

Speed Limit

Do not exceed 40km/h in school zones.



Other common parking offences

- Parking on a naturestrip
- Unreasonably obstructing (flow of traffic)
- Double parked
- Stop too close to a school crossing
- Park within 3 metres of a continuous dividing line or dividing strip.



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Attendance

A reminder our first school bell goes at 8:50am each morning and the students are dismissed at 3:15pm each day.

The school is supervised between 8:30am and 3:30pm each day. If your child is at school outside these hours, please register with BIG Childcare.

Absences

If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify the school as soon as possible on the day of absence by telephone. Please call the school office and let the staff know your child's name, class, date of absences and reason. Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility. If your child is absent and the school has not been contacted, we will ring you as soon as practicable on the same day. If we are unable to contact you, the absence will be marked as unexplained.

Late Arrivals/Early Departures

It is important that children arrive on time. If your child is late for school (after 9:00am), they must report to the office to register their late arrival and receive a late pass which will be handed to the class teacher. Children

are not permitted to leave the school ground at any time during the day. Parents wishing to collect their child from school prior to 3:15pm dismissal, must go to the office to register their early departure. At any time you require someone else to collect your child early from school, you will need to contact the office on 9747 1210 to let them know who is authorised to do so.



School success starts
with attendance

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We partner with Big Childcare to provide Before School, After School, Curriculum Day and Holiday Care. You can drop your children off before heading to work or pick them up after you finish, knowing they are well cared for by the team.



How to attend?

To attend our program, you must first enrol your child.

Once enrolment is complete, you can then make a booking to secure a spot in advance for your child. Follow these 3 simple steps:

Preparing for Enrolment:

- ✓ Any medical documents (such as an action plan signed by a doctor if your child has asthma, allergies and anaphylaxis)
- ✓ Any documentation relating to sole parenting, custodial orders etc.
- ✓ Centrelink Customer Reference Number (CRN) of: 1) parent/guardian and 2) child
- ✓ Access to MyGov
- ✓ Have your payment details ready

b) Contact your centre manager via email, mobile, or in person at our centre.

3. Apply for Child Care Subsidy

Enrolment and Bookings

Permanent Bookings:

For children who use the service on a weekly basis, permanent bookings are considered to be at least one session per week for an entire term or more.

Casual Bookings:

A casual booking is a one-off booking that occurs occasionally and is not part of the permanent booking schedule for that child.

Casual bookings can be made by contacting your centre manager via phone call, text message or email.

Cancellations:

Bookings can be cancelled up to 48 hours prior to the session without incurring a session fee. For cancellations within 48 hours of the session, you will be charged the full fee, less any Child Care Subsidy you are entitled to, unless you are able to provide a medical certificate.

Payment:

How to pay:

Payments can be made by Direct Debit via our third-party provider, Debit Success.

When will I be charged?

For Direct Debit payments, families are charged weekly in arrears. Statements will be emailed on Fridays to your email address registered in your My Family Lounge account. Your bank account will be automatically debited with the amount you owe each Monday.

Payment Processing:

Big Childcare invoice in arrears from the bank account nominated by the family using Debit Success.

Statements are sent on a weekly basis prior to direct debit the following week. EFTPOS Payments can be arranged with your centre manager.

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Tuesday 8th February was 'Safer Internet Day'. Students in grades 1-6 participated in activities to learn about staying safe online. The grade 1-2 students read a book called 'Swish and Glide and Rule Number 5'. This book is available for parents to watch online or even get a free copy sent to them. The main tips students learnt from this book was to make good choices when using technology, to be safe, be kind and ask for help if you see something online you don't like.



All students in years 1-6 have been given an Acceptable Use of Technology Agreement to take home. We ask that you read through and have a discussion about these agreements with your child and return the signature page/s to school as soon as possible. This is our record that your child agrees that they understand how to use technology safely and will do so at school.

Rockbank Primary School has made a commitment through the eSmart Schools program to educate our students about responsible technology use and help keep them safe whilst using technology.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support
