2024 Prep Enrolments are due by Friday 28 JULY, 2023.

Term 3 is a ten-week term with swimming in the final two weeks. Juniors swim in Week 9 and Seniors will go in Week 10. If you are a parent of a junior student, it is highly recommended that you spend some time with your child/children to practise getting undressed and dressed independently, without adult assistance, in preparation for swimming. This will be of great help for them to build independence and have success in our swimming program.

Last term we farewelled two staff members, Ms Ninkovic, 5/6 teacher and Nici, one of our ES team. Ms Ninkovic has been extremely helpful in coming back as a CRT, and filling in as the 1/2A classroom teacher for weeks 1 & 2. Nici has decided to move into the Allied Health industry and complete further studies/training. Ms Murden is now the full time 5/6 classroom teacher and Mrs Batra will work two days in the 3/4A classroom. We thank our students and families for the positive support you give to our school during these changes.

This week, we received 2023 NAPLAN results and have forwarded the student reports of all Year 3 & 5 students to their families this week. We say congratulations to our students who completed NAPLAN. Whilst this is a national assessment conducted across Australia, it is also one assessment out of many that your child completes in a year. Over the next few weeks, our school and network of schools will start to analyse the NAPLAN data to provide insights into where we can improve student learning and to celebrate student results.

CONTINUATION OF PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

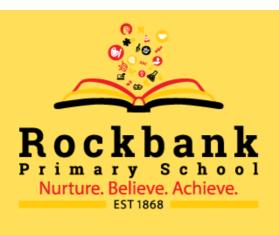
The Education Department now has been rolling out the 'Disability & Inclusion (D&I) Reform' across Victorian schools in a staggered approach. Rockbank PS will implement this reform in 2024. By the end of this year, we will have developed a D&I team of staff to lead, manage and work in this area. In Term 4, we will start to share more information about this reform with our school community. Students receive house point tokens for demonstrating our school values while out in the yard.

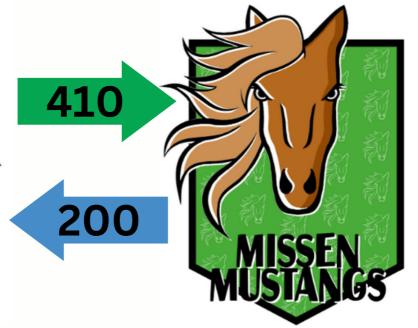

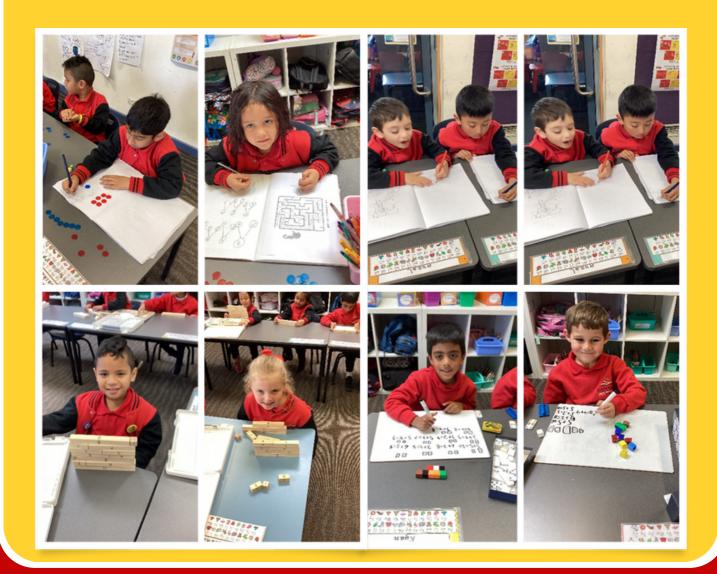

FD with Mrs Sharma

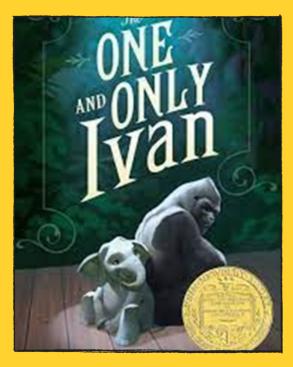
In numeracy, we are learning that parts make a whole. Students are using counters, bond blocks, dominoes and unifix cubes to solve part-part-whole.

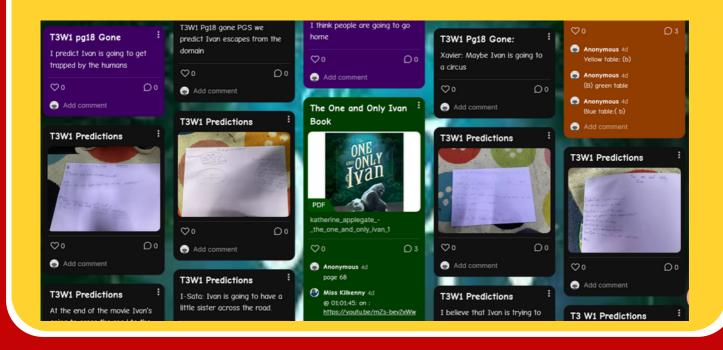


Have you ever read *The One and Only Ivan*? Because this term, we in 34D are reading *The One and Only Ivan*.

Mental Health & Social Media

How to look after your mental wellbeing on social media (from esafety.gov.au)

1. Choose how and when you chat

Group chats are a good way to talk with close friends, but being available 24/7 can be stressful.

 Take a break from the conversation by muting notifications on WhatsApp or choosing one of the privacy settings on Snapchat.

2. Think about the impact your story might have

Sharing online is a great way to express yourself but posting personal or confronting content can hurt you and others.

- Think about who will see your story and whether they will respect your post –
 especially if it contains personal information, like how you are feeling. You can
 change your settings to close friends only on Instagram for example, to control who
 sees the information.
- When you live stream and share content like an Instagram Reel, work out what you
 might do if people respond in a negative way. Consider what could happen if the
 content is reposted.

3. Choose what appears in your feed

Scrolling through YouTube or Tik Tok can be a great way to relieve stress and even learn new skills, but some material could make you feel uncomfortable.

- Be aware of the type of content that might upset you.
- Limit the amount of distressing content that you see. You can hide content on Snapchat or flag videos as not interested on Tik Tok to stop stories appearing in your feed.

4. Keep it positive

Use the resources on social networks to help you and others maintain a healthy state of mind.

- Look out for safety and wellbeing tips. Tik Tok tips offers technical and mental health advice for staying safe and Snapchat provides wellbeing support.
- Check how much time you spend looking at negative news or 'doomscrolling'. Try swapping your news time for more positive content instead.

Parents, please note that the minimum age for most social media is 13
