This week in Numeracy, 34 E used multiplicative strategies to multiply and divide by ten, recognising the patterns in multiplying and dividing. 34E math Group One demonstrated this by using unfix blocks and the reasoning that:
"If I know 4 groups of 10 makes 40 , then what is 4 groups of 100 and so on?"
$G$ roup One were making groups of 10 with unific blocks and by the end of the session made a collection of 38 groups of ten.
They showed that they understood this link to multiplication, if you have 38 tens this makes a total of 380 .
